# FP-20xx FieldPoint Quick Start Guide


- What You Need FP-20xx LabVIEW RT controller
  - to Get Set Up 35 mm DIN rail
    - Two DIN rail locks (included)
    - Terminal base(s)
    - I/O module(s)
    - 11–30 VDC power supply

- Accessories: Ethernet cable, flathead screwdriver
- PC running Windows
- National Instruments FieldPoint Software CD
- LabVIEW RT



Mount the module on a DIN rail.


A. Unlock rail clip.






NOTE Do not use spliced DIN rails. Use only a single DIN rail.

B. Hook lip on back of module onto top of DIN rail, press down, and snap into place.



C. Slide module into position and lock rail clip.




# Install the Terminal Base(s)




**CAUTION** Terminal bases must be connected to the network module before applying power to the module. Do *not* connect or disconnect terminal bases while power is applied to the network module.

A. Unlock rail clip. B. Press base onto rail. C. Slide base into position and lock rail clip. Be careful not to bend any pins.



- D. Repeat for each terminal base, up to nine for each network module in most cases. You can use one or two extender cables (which you can order separately) if the FieldPoint bank is too long for the available space. Make sure there are no gaps between terminal bases.
- E. You *must* install DIN rail locks at each end of the bank to ensure reliable connections between terminal bases and network module. Two rail locks are included with each network module. Place protective cover on last base.



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# Install the I/O Module(s)

It does not matter where you install each I/O module, except in the following cases:

• If you plan to cascade power between any I/O modules using the V and C terminals, those modules should be grouped together.



**CAUTION** Cascading power defeats isolation.


- For more accurate measurements, place thermocouple modules away from heat sources, including network modules and relay modules.
- A. Align slots on module with guide rails on base, and press module onto base until terminal base latch locks module in place.



B. Repeat for each I/O module.


# Connect the FP-20xx to the Network

Connect the FP-20xx to an Ethernet network by connecting the RJ-45 Ethernet port of the FP-20xx to an Ethernet hub using a standard Category 5 Ethernet cable.



Optionally, you can connect an FP-20*xx* directly to a computer using an Ethernet crossover cable.


Do not use a cable longer than 100 m. If you are using a 100 Mbps Ethernet,



National Instruments recommends using a Category 5 shielded twisted-pair cable. If you need to build your own cable, refer to the *FP-20xx User Manual* specifications section for cabling details.


## Wire Power to the FieldPoint System

A. Connect power supply leads to the V and C terminals of the network module. Use an 11–30 VDC, 15 W minimum power supply such as the NI FP-PS-4. Refer to the I/O module operating instructions for the power requirements of each module. Refer to the *Specifications* section of this document for instructions on calculating the power requirement of the FieldPoint bank.



B Connect power to the I/O modules that require external power for outputs (examples include output, counter, relay, PWM, PG, and QUAD modules). It is generally best to power each such module by connecting an external power supply to the V<sub>SUP</sub> and COM terminals. Refer to the I/O module operating instructions for power requirements, detailed wiring diagrams, and safe wiring practices.

**CAUTION** Cascading power from neighboring bases or network modules defeats isolation between cascaded modules.



# Power Up the FieldPoint System




**CAUTION** Terminal bases must be connected to the FP-20*xx* before power is applied to the FP-20*xx*.

Make sure the RESET DIP switch is not on. Plug in each power supply to the FieldPoint bank. You should see the **POWER** and **STATUS** LEDs come on. After about 5 seconds, the **STATUS** LED begins flashing, one flash at a time. This indicates that the FP-20*xx* is ready to be configured. (If the **STATUS** LED turns off, and the **A**, **B**, **C**, and **D** LEDs come on, the FP-20*xx* has been configured and LabVIEW RT is starting up.) If the LEDs do not follow this sequence, refer to the *FP-20xx User Manual* troubleshooting appendix.



## Install Software on the Host PC

A. Install the software packages you plan to use, such as LabVIEW, LabVIEW RT, Measurement Studio, VI Logger, or LabWindows<sup>™</sup>/CVI<sup>™</sup>, before you install the FieldPoint software. The FieldPoint software installation installs the LabVIEW VIs and examples, and LabWindows/CVI instrument driver only if it finds the corresponding development software installed.



- B. Close all other applications.
- C. Insert the National Instruments FieldPoint Software CD into the CD-ROM drive of your computer.
- D. Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the installation.



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NOTE If the setup does not launch automatically, select  ${\bf Start}_{R}{\bf un}$  from Windows, enter d:\setup, where d is the letter of the CD-ROM drive, and select  ${\bf 0K}.$




