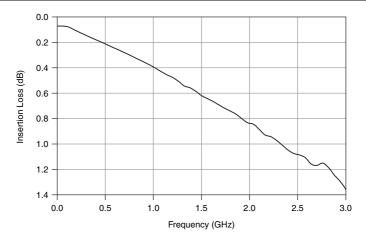
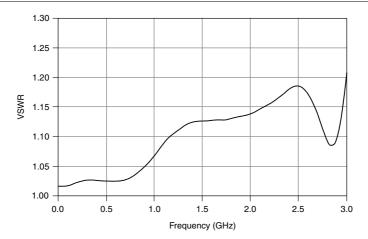
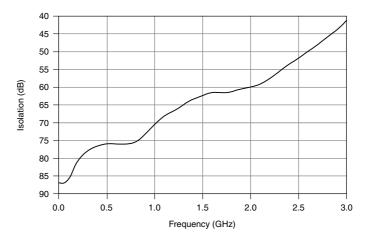


Figure 2. Typical VSWR

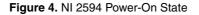

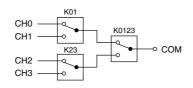

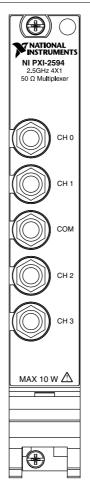
