## Installation and Configuration

#### Installation

The x8 MXI-Express fiber cable is distinct from a common copper cable in that it is directional.

The fiber cable must be connected with the connector labeled **HOST** plugged into the upstream device, and the connector labeled TARGET plugged into the downstream device.

Upstream devices include the host adapter (NI PCIe-8381) or the daisy-chain module (NI PXIe-8384).

Downstream devices include the Slot 1 controller (NI PXIe-8381) and the NI PXImc module (NI PXIe-8383mc).




Figure 1. Cable Assembly

### System Requirements

The x8 MXI-Express fiber cable requires a Constant Frequency Clock (CFC) be provided to the cable. Gen II x8 PCI Express and PXI Express remote controllers use Spread Spectrum Clocking (SSC) by default.





Figure 3. NI PCIe-8381 Set to CFC Mode by Toggling Position 3 of SW1 to the ON Position

You must change the setting using the toggle switch on your MXI-Express Gen II x8 remote controller. Refer to Figures 2 and 3 for the location of the respective switches.

Figure 2. NI PXIe-8384 and NI PXIe-8383mc with SW5 Toggled in CFC Position
